Planned Giving

There are two options for Planned Giving (donating) to the Parish.

- 1. **Boxes of weekly envelopes** for planned giving are currently being prepared and will be ready in the coming weeks. Each family/household is encouraged to take a box and return the envelope for each week at Sunday Mass.
- 2. The other option is to fill in a **Standing Order Form** to make a regular donation from your account. These forms are available at the back of the Church.

If you donate on a regular basis—thank you. We are aware of the pressure that is on families and are grateful for your contributions.

If you have not taken a box of envelopes before and are in a position to do so, any contribution is welcome.

Can you help with distributing the boxes? This involves being at the back of the Church before and after Mass over two/three Sundays and giving the correct box to each family. It is a short term commitment.
