Lent this year begins on Wed, February 14th. Ever wondered how this date is decided? The simple answer is that it depends on when Easter is. Easter follows a lunar, rather than a solar, calendar and is



celebrated on the Sunday that follows the first full moon after March 21, the vernal (spring) equinox. In 2024, Easter falls on March 31st.

The season of Lent comprises 40 days before Easter without counting Sundays which, even though they are called "Sundays of Lent," are not days of penance. So 40 days, along with 6 Sundays, brings us to the date for Ash Wednesday.
